Site supervisors and managers will ensure that all persons required to attend on site for work in their area have completed a Site-specific Safety Induction and the Work Cover accredited General Construction Industry Safety Induction prior to commencing work, all works are to be carried out as per CBD Environmental Policy.

Site supervisors and managers will regularly check that persons in their area carrying out any work for which a Certificate of Compliance, Certificate of Competency or Licence is required, are in possession of the appropriate document, and are following the Environmental Policy guide lines.

Site Supervisors and Managers are required to monitor the need for ongoing safety training in accordance with procedures for OHS and Environmental Training.

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
